Application for the “Certificate of Eligibility” (CoE)	
Applicants are required to apply for the CoE via online system to obtain the Japanese visa. The URL for this Online Application System will be sent to you by email from Kobe Univ (intl-cesr@office.kobe-u.ac.jp) around November-December.

Student Visa Obligations	<p>Undergraduate Students: Must take more than 10 hours of lecture which equals to 6 classes per week. Graduate Students (Master/Doctor): Must have more than 10 hours of research hours including at least 1 class per week.</p>

Japanese Language Course	<p>The Global Education Center (GEC) offers Japanese language courses for exchange students. VISA	<p>After acceptance, Kobe University will apply for the student's CoE (Certificate of Eligibility) that is required for the “College-Student VISA”. CoE is usually issued one month prior to enrollment. (Please note that we do not guarantee 100% successful result of CoE application. The final decision rests in the hands of the Immigration Bureau of Japan and Japanese Embassy).</p> <p>Students will need to apply for “College-Study VISA” at the Embassy of Japan or the Consulate-General of Japan before your entry to Japan.</p>	
Entry to Japan	<p>It is strongly advised to enter Japan via Narita, Haneda, Chubu, or Kansai International Airports in order to have your Residence Card issued by the Immigration Bureau of Japan upon your arrival. In order to process your student status and course registration at Kobe University, it is mandatory to have your Residence Card information.</p>	

Airport Pick up	No pick-up service is arranged by Kobe University. Please note that exchange students are fully responsible for arranging accommodation on the arrival day if you cannot enter the dormitory on the same day.																								
Insurance	<p>National Health Insurance: The Ministry of Health, Labor, and Welfare in Japan now requires all College Student Visa holders to become a registered member of the Japan National Health Insurance. All exchange students must enroll in it. Students will pay monthly premiums (Approximately 2,400 JPY per month). Upon joining this system, students will be charged only 30% of the incurred medical cost.</p> <p>Kobe University PAS : PAS (Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research) is a nationwide system to indemnify students for the number of days that medical treatment is needed for injury incurred during regular curricular activities and while commuting to or from University (1,000JPY up to 1 year). All students are required to participate in this insurance plan.</p> <p>Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Couples with PAS for International Students (Inbound Futai Gakusou) This insurance offers expanded coverage for international students. Kobe University requires all international students to sign up for this comprehensive insurance at the time of enrollment.</p> <p>Inbound Medical Assistance Service (IMAS) IMAS provides international students with 24 hours multilingual medical assistance including references to appropriate hospitals, telephone consultations, interpretation during hospital visits, as well as contacting and assisting family in your home country. Kobe University requires all international students to sign up for this service.</p>
